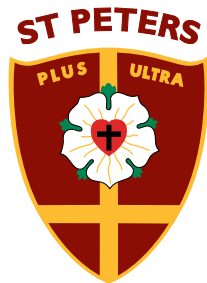

WHY CHOOSE ST PETERS?



At St Peters we want each student to flourish and achieve their best, to enjoy school and learning, to learn how to learn, to be challenged, to build resilience and to make a difference in the world.

St Peters Lutheran College Indooroopilly has an enviable reputation as a school of excellence providing holistic Christian co-education for Prep – Year 12 students, with boarding available from Year 6.

As a Christian co-educational day and boarding school, boys and girls learn together as part of a community that reflects the multi-faith and multicultural society in which we live. St Peters welcomes students of all Christian denominations and other religions or philosophical perspectives.

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Our students consistently achieve excellent academic results and we strive to provide a quality holistic

teaching and learning environment where students are encouraged to realise their full potential through a broad liberal academic program: faith, character and values development, music and the arts, sport, leadership opportunities and service learning.

St Peters facilities are second to none. Students have convenient access to sophisticated facilities on campus, including: a 1000 seat state-of-the-art Performing Arts Centre, well-equipped libraries, air-conditioned classrooms, specialist science labs, fine sporting facilities including three sporting ovals, two swimming pools, Health and Wellbeing Centre and Refectory.

Students also benefit from our iconic College-operated Outdoor Education experience at Ironbark, near Crows Nest, approximately two and a half hours west of Brisbane.



AND SO IT BEGAN ...



St Peters Lutheran College was established by the Lutheran Church in 1945 with 56 boarding students on a parcel of land in the western Brisbane suburb of Indooroopilly.

Through the generosity and vision of its founders, and stability in leadership, St Peters has grown to become the largest Lutheran school in Queensland with just seven Heads of College to have served since its inception.

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The iconic Ross Roy House was the main building and focus for early College life, with Luther House built by voluntary labour soon after the College commenced.

As demand for the school grew, so did the construction of facilities including a Lower Primary precinct in 1973 and Upper Primary in 1978.

The College's Outdoor Education Centre, Ironbark, near Crows Nest in Queensland, was established in 1974 as a trial program, and in 1976 as an ongoing Outdoor Education Program. Visionary in nature, this life-changing experience is held over a five-week period for Year 9 students.

In 2007, the Junior High Sub-School structure was introduced to cater specifically for the learning and developmental needs of students in Years 7-9.

In 2008, St Peters established a second school campus at Springfield, which began as a Prep to Year 8 school and now caters for students from Kindergarten to Year 12.

All St Peters schools operate under the guidance of the St Peters Lutheran College Council and Head of College, and are governed by the Lutheran Church of Australia Queensland District.





THE ST PETERS JOURNEY



Children are rich in potential, creativity and imagination. It is therefore important to establish an environment where students can build a lifelong love of learning.

PRIMARY YEARS (PREP-YEAR 6)

The St Peters journey begins in our Lower Primary School from Prep to Year 4.

During these early years, our focus is developing core literacy and numeracy skills as students engage in an inquiry-based curriculum.

During Years 5 and 6, students move to the Upper Primary precinct, where the development of our young adolescents is fostered through active learning, strong relationships, cooperation in teams and independent learning.

The highly acclaimed International Baccalaureate Primary Years Program (PYP) provides the overarching curriculum framework in the Primary School.

JUNIOR HIGH (YEARS 7-9)

St Peters Junior High is specifically tailored to care, support and guide adolescents in Years 7-9.

In purpose-built facilities, students entering Year 7 embark on a program of supported transition as they embark on their secondary education, whereby the curriculum and pastoral care programs are closely aligned to promote student engagement in a 'positive education and wellbeing' program.

In Year 9, a compulsory five-week residential life-skills program at the College's Ironbark Outdoor Education Centre is a significant 'rite of passage' in the life of the students. For many, this experience is life-changing and sets the foundations for valuable life-skills including independence, perseverance, teamwork and leadership.

SENIOR SCHOOL (YEARS 10-12)

The Senior School encompasses Years 10-12. Few schools in Queensland can offer the variety of subject choices and pathways that allow our students to fully explore their areas of interest and relative strengths. We offer the QCAA OP System, the IB Diploma and a number of VET offerings.

The Senior School provides our students a balanced and broad education in their pathway of choice, through a supportive network of teachers, career guidance, counselling and pastoral care.

As students enter their Senior years at St Peters, they can build strong foundations for tertiary and higher learning through our academic, vocational education and co-curricular programs, complemented by the College's quality teaching staff and extensive educational, sporting and music facilities.







LEARNING AND INNOVATION: THE ACADEMIC IMPERATIVE



We strive to provide a quality holistic teaching and learning environment where students are encouraged to realise their full potential.

At St Peters, we believe a challenging, nurturing, supportive, and innovative learning environment should be at the heart of every child's educational experience.

- * Outdoor Education Program
- * Student leadership opportunities; and
- * Service Learning and Faith development.

We aspire to consolidate activities in and out of the classroom through comprehensive and inclusive curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular programs and student leadership opportunities that support the spiritual, social and emotional development of our students.

ST PETERS OLD SCHOLARS ASSOCIATION (SPOSA)

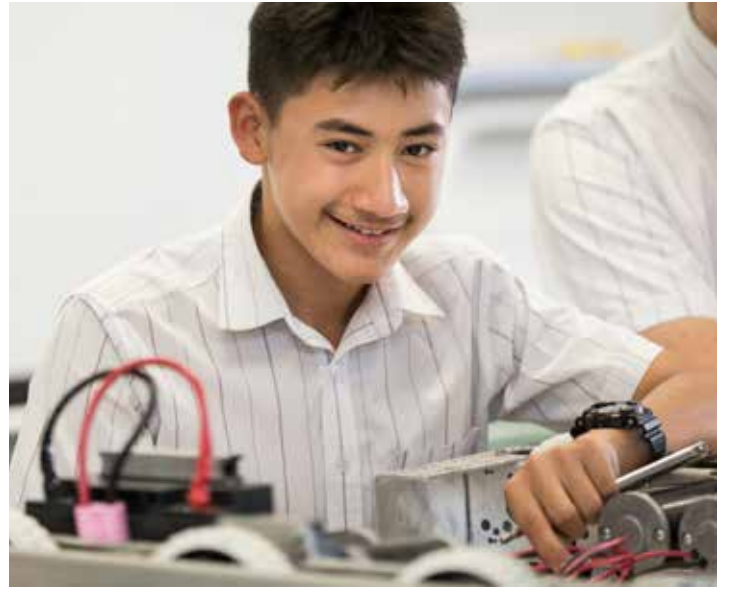

St Peters has a proud tradition in boarding, established in 1945 with 56 founding boarding students.

Today, St Peters continues to provide a safe and nurturing home away from home for girls and boys boarding in Years 6-12.

Our boarding accommodates Australian and international students with full-time, weekly and short-term boarding options.

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Boarding provides an opportunity to form lifelong friendships, with an emphasis on character development, self-discipline, resilience, independence, tolerance and leadership.

Our professional boarding staff work with the students and their families to meet the academic and pastoral care needs of all boarders.

Staff encourage, coach and support students in less formal settings and promote holistic learning through participation in co-curricular, extra-curricular, cultural, recreational and sporting activities.

The girls and boys boarding houses offer comfortable accommodation, air conditioning, skype capability and secure internet access.

Dining in our purpose-built Café 45 provides boarders with a diverse, healthy cuisine in a modern and attractive café setting.

As a co-educational boarding school, all family members may attend St Peters, providing an important sense of stability, connection and belonging.

1 MAKING THE APPLICATION

2 INTERVIEW AND OFFER OF A PLACE

For intake Year levels (Prep, Year 5 and Year 7) applications are reviewed approximately two years prior to the proposed year of entry and applicants will be invited to an enrolment interview. For non-intake Year levels (all other Year levels) applications are reviewed in the year prior to the proposed year of entry and applicants will be invited to an enrolment interview. Following an interview, written offers will be made to successful applicants.

3 ACCEPTANCE OF OFFER

To confirm the offer of enrolment, parents are required to return the signed enrolment documentation with the payment of the non-refundable Enrolment Confirmation fee.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS (REQUIRING A STUDY VISA)

We welcome applications from overseas students (student visa required). If you would like further information about enrolling to study on a student visa, please contact our Enrolments Office.
